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POWER OF PURPOSE

Dear Y Supporter,

As we close another year of serving Grays Harbor, we want to thank you for your continued support. Because of you, the YMCA continues to grow, adapt, and meet the evolving needs of our community. This year, we expanded access, deepened our impact, and strengthened the foundation that allows all in our community to learn, grow, and thrive.

Grays Harbor Speaks...

Through continued engagement and participation, our community shows us every day that the YMCA is an essential resource. With **6,777 members** and **224,791 visits** to our main facility, the Y remains a trusted place where individuals and families come to connect, stay active, and belong.

The Y Responds... Ensuring Access for All

Access remains at the heart of our mission. Through our *For All* program, **35% of our members received financial assistance**, with more than **\$370,463 awarded in membership scholarships**.

In addition, we provided:

- Over **\$53,000 in program scholarships** supporting childcare, early learning readiness, youth sports, and teen programs
- Nearly **\$100,000 in swim lesson scholarships**, teaching lifesaving skills to **2,151 youth**
- Over **\$71,000 in camp scholarships**, helping **558 youth** experience Camp Bishop
- We also helped meet basic needs in our community by providing **15,973 free snacks** and **39,908 free meals** to kids who needed them most.

Youth Development: Building Futures

We are proud to support youth at every stage of their journey. In 2025, we relaunched our **Harbor After School Program** in partnership with the Aberdeen School District, providing free mentoring and support to over **241 youth**.

Our YMCA continues to be a place where young people gain confidence, skills, and opportunity, and where many begin their workforce journey. With over **301 employees**, the Y serves as a first job for many local youth, helping develop the next generation of leaders.

Healthy Living: Strengthening Community Wellness

Our commitment to health goes beyond fitness. This year:

- **154 adults** participated in evidenced based chronic disease prevention programs
- Our largest evidence-based program recorded **3,352 class visits**
- Over **1,677 aging adults** were supported through memberships, scholarships, and insurance partnerships

These programs are creating real, measurable improvements in health and quality of life across our community.

Social Responsibility: Bringing Community Together

Our events and partnerships continue to create moments of connection and joy:

- **117 teens** attended our free Teen Bash
- **500 community members** joined us for the Harvest Carnival
- **135 attended Turkey Bingo**
- **111 participated in Healthy Kids Day**
- **216 youth** received gifts through our Giving Tree

Through incredible partnerships, we also expanded our reach:

- Santa's Workshop provided over **700 pairs of shoes, toys, and holiday meal kits** (with support from Grays Harbor Community Foundation and TMWG)
- Spring Break meal kits were distributed with support from the Aberdeen Elks

Powered by Community Support

None of this would be possible without you. Through the generosity of our donors, we raised over **\$331,000** in our Annual Campaign, fueling programs that ensure everyone has access to the Y. Our volunteers also played a vital role, contributing **2,163 hours** of service to strengthen our mission.

Investing in Our Future

This year, we made significant investments in our facilities and programs, including:

- Replacement of **lighted sign** for entrance in parking lot
- Addition of **auto scrubber** and refinishing of all **hardwood floors** and **weight room**
- Addition of a **new 15-passenger bus**
- Expansion of the **Camp Bishop waterfront water park**
- **Waterfront bulkhead** extension at Camp Bishop
- Energy efficiency improvements including installation of **new LED and emergency lighting, ductless heatpumps** for Group Exercise Room, **Energy Audit, OM Plan and EM Plan**
- New health and wellness equipment including **seated stepper, seated arm ergometer, stepmill, smith machine, upright and recumbent bikes, dumbbells and bars**
- Addition of an **indoor traversing wall** in the gym
- Facility upgrades including **new carpet, painting**, and other improvements
- New program enhancements like a **ping pong table at Camp Bishop**
- Camp Bishop **lodge painting** and **lighting** replacement

WHAT'S NEXT

At the YMCA of Grays Harbor, we're continuing our mission to strengthen community by expanding our reach and deepening our impact.

- Continuing to serve outside these walls – with a focus on school age youth of low-income families we are set to continue expanding programming outside these walls. Looking to East County and beyond to offer programming.
- Aging Adults population – created connected communities. Our intention is to remove isolation and combat loneliness. We have secured funding to expand our connected communities outside our doors to new demographics. We will be launching offsite programming in the coming year.
- Sustainability – this year we are set to invest over \$1,000,000 in facility upgrades including Pool and Locker room HVAC and exterior facility improvements. To ensure our building is here for another 25 years to serve Grays Harbor.
- Busiest camp season on record. This year Camp Bishop is fully booked for overnight youth camp and mission centered rentals from May through September. Planning to be our busiest camp season on record since it was built more than 80 years ago.

At the Y, we believe that everyone deserves the opportunity to live a healthier, more connected life, and we're honored to continue growing alongside the community we serve.

Like *This Place*

James Naismith, Inventor of Basketball

Over the past 175 years, the YMCA has grown from a small movement founded in 1851 into one of the most impactful nonprofit organizations in the world. Built on a mission to strengthen spirit, mind, and body, the YMCA has consistently evolved to meet the changing needs of communities. From its early roots in providing safe spaces and moral guidance during the Industrial Revolution, it expanded its reach by pioneering educational programs such as night school and English as a Second Language classes. The YMCA also played a significant cultural role; introducing sports like basketball and volleyball, promoting water safety, and even helping inspire the creation of Father's Day. These contributions reflect a long-standing commitment to innovation and community well-being.

In Washington State and beyond, the YMCA continues to serve as a cornerstone of community life. With a focus on youth development, healthy living, and social responsibility, it provides critical services such as licensed child care, chronic disease prevention programs, and life-saving swim instruction. The YMCA fosters belonging and connection, welcoming people of all backgrounds while supporting physical and mental health. As a major employer and community partner, it contributes to economic vitality and helps individuals build skills, confidence, and resilience. Celebrating 175 years nationally; and 150 years in Washington; the YMCA's enduring legacy is one of adaptability, inclusion, and meaningful impact on generations of individuals and families.

IGNITING CHANGE

For more than 124 years, the YMCA of Grays Harbor has been a steady and transformative presence in the community, evolving alongside the people it serves. Since its founding in 1902, the Y has created spaces for connection, growth, and opportunity; from the early days of camps at what is now Failor Lake to the construction of Camp Bishop, a project brought to life in a single day by hundreds of dedicated volunteers. Generations of families have learned to swim, build confidence, and form lasting friendships through programs hosted at the Miller Natatorium and later expanded facilities. The Y's commitment to inclusion also marked a turning point in the 1950s as it became a place for women, girls, and entire families, reflecting a broader vision of community and belonging.

In recent decades, the YMCA of Grays Harbor has continued to deepen its impact through innovation and partnership. The opening of the current facility in 2001, expansion of early learning programs, and the growth of afterschool mentoring have strengthened support for youth and working families across the county. Initiatives like the Grays Harbor Swims Endowment ensure children gain life-saving skills, while scholarships and community-funded campaigns make programs accessible to all. Even in times of challenge, including the COVID-19 pandemic, the Y adapted to meet urgent needs, reinforcing its role as a trusted community anchor. Today, through chronic disease prevention programs, expanded childcare capacity, and continued collaboration with schools and local organizations, the YMCA of Grays Harbor remains committed to building a healthier, more connected, and more resilient community for generations to come.

LEAVING A LEGACY

Tom Jackson

Honoring the Legacy of Tom Jackson

The YMCA is stronger because of the generous gifts of time, talent, and resources from those who believe in our mission. One of the most meaningful ways we show our gratitude is by caring for and investing in the places and programs those gifts have made possible.

At Camp Bishop, we are building a small program and storage space near the Dining Hall to better support the experiences that matter most to our campers. This project honors the legacy of Tom Jackson, whose dedication helped shape the camp we know today.

Tom gave countless hours to Camp Bishop, leading improvements, rebuilding cabins, renovating the lodge and deck and leading the construction of the Caretaker's House. He believed deeply in strengthening the camp for future generations and found joy in working alongside others to do it.

After his passing in 2024, his family and community gave in his memory to carry that legacy forward. This new space reflects Tom's enduring spirit of service, generosity, and love for Camp Bishop.

In Loving Memory of Tom Jackson, from Tom Jackson's Wife and Daughters

Tom Jackson gave so much of himself to YMCA Camp Bishop. He generously donated his time, equipment, and hard-earned knowledge to strengthen a place that meant a great deal to him and his family. For more than a year, Tom worked almost every weekend rebuilding cabins and constructing the caretaker's residence; quietly and steadily improving the camp for everyone who would come after.

What Tom loved most was being shoulder-to-shoulder with the people who cared about Camp Bishop as much as he did. He treasured the early mornings, the shared laughs, the problem-solving, and the simple satisfaction of looking back at the end of a long day and knowing they had done something that mattered together. The camaraderie filled his heart—the feeling that he belonged, that his hands and his presence were part of something bigger than himself. Tom poured his whole self into the work, using skills he had taught himself and genuinely loved, and he found deep joy in helping others and seeing the camp grow stronger because of it.

Camp Bishop was more than a project to Tom; it was part of his family story. His father was one of the original Kiwanis members who helped build the camp in a single day, and Tom proudly carried that legacy forward. On the other side of the lake, Tom also helped build his family's cabin, where he spent countless weekends with his loved ones, enjoying the same place he worked so hard to care for.

After Tom's passing in 2024, our family honored his dedication and love for Camp Bishop with a \$5,000 donation; joined by others who gave in his memory; to help create the next chapter of the camp he loved. It is our hope that these gifts, like Tom's many hours of work, will continue to support Camp Bishop and reflect the spirit of generosity, service, and family that he lived by.

Honoring the Legacy of Bob Ruecker

In Loving Memory of Bob Ruecker, from Bob Ruecker's Wife and Daughters

Our family's connection to the YMCA began early and has remained a meaningful part of all of our lives over the years. From a young age, and as parents, we were involved in programs that helped shape who we are today.

Our daughters began swim lessons at the YMCA as infants and continued through their elementary years. The Y was a place where they learned important life skills, built confidence, and felt part of something larger than themselves. They also participated in gymnastics and other activities that brought encouragement, structure, and joy into their childhood, while Patty experienced the Y as a place that supported and strengthened our family.

Some of our most cherished memories come from summers spent at Camp Bishop. We remember singing songs, performing skits, attempting to water ski, and jumping into the lake on warm days, especially after reading letters from home. Camp was a place of laughter, growth, and connection that left a lasting impression on all of us.

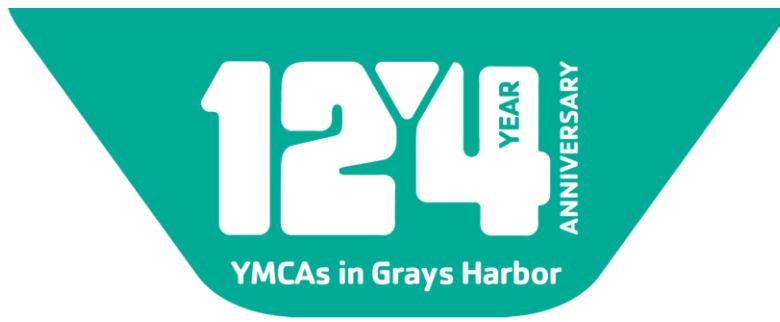
Our connection extended well beyond participation. In the early 1990s, one of our daughters had the opportunity to serve on the Camp Bishop staff, and as a family, we often visited during the off-season to help with cleanup and care. Those experiences instilled in us a deep appreciation for giving back and caring for places that hold meaning for so many. That legacy has continued into the next generation—her children have been actively involved in their local YMCAs in Wenatchee and Spokane Valley, where they first attended overnight camp and now serve as counselors themselves, carrying that spirit of service forward.

Bob was also deeply involved in the YMCA in Aberdeen, serving on the board and supporting its mission in meaningful ways. He valued the role the Y plays in strengthening community and ensuring access for all. Patty and Bob also participated in YMCA-organized white water rafting trips on the Deschutes River. These experiences were incredibly special and brought people together in a unique and lasting way.

Because of these lifelong connections, our family wanted to give in a way that supports the YMCA as a whole. This gift is meant to help sustain and strengthen the programs that meant so much to us, ensuring that others can have the same opportunities to learn, grow, and create lasting memories.

It is our hope that this support will continue to carry forward the spirit of the YMCA: a place where families are built, skills are learned, and community is strengthened every day.

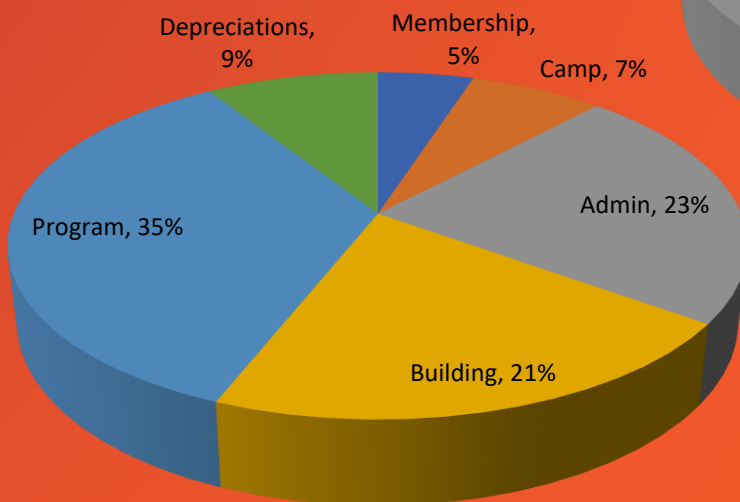
